#### WHAT IS WAC?

WAC is the Worship Arts Committee. The committee attempts to plan meaningful worship experiences using techniques we learned from attending workshops on worship design. Our goal is to create "an intentional journey of praise, prayer and growth" in every service we create. During Advent, for example, did you notice...

- The theme, let us walk in the light of the Lord, expressed in the call to worship and in the sung response.
- Each week the light increased. More Advent wreath candles were lit. This culminated with numerous votive candles and lights in the garland on Christmas Eve.
- Carrying the light out at the end of each service, symbolizing Christ's mandate for us to be light to the world.
- A new bulletin format featuring classic art work of the nativity on the front of each bulletin.
- A communion table display that became more and more elaborate over time. Each week more flowers were added, relating to the scripture "the desert shall rejoice and blossom."
- Numerous wrapped gifts, some of which were taken away, as the sermon made us think about what is really important during the season of Advent.
- The chime peal, gradually increasing in complexity and in number of players each week, as "O Come, Let Us Adore Him" rang out.

#### ABOUT THE MUSIC

The text of today's solo comes from the book of Ecclesiastes, Chapter 3. This book, along with the books of Psalms, Proverbs, Job, and Song of Songs form a section of the Bible referred to as "Wisdom" literature. Other books of the Old Testament are historical or prophetic in nature, but in the Wisdom books, the authors ask questions about God, humanity, and the nature of evil and suffering. In reading these books we can see that "... the Israelites grappled with the same faith issues that we do today: they asked tough questions about sin and suffering; they experienced joy and confidence in God's love; they looked for God in life's pleasures and trials alike; they sometimes entertained doubts and they looked to God for help both physically and spiritually....the wisdom books show us that God values and responds to these myriad questions and prayers. We can take comfort that no experience in our lives, whether wonderful or terrible, can place us outside the love and understanding of a gracious God." (source: www.biblegateway.com)

#### About the Music (continued)

In the hymn *How Firm a Foundation* (included in *Sure Foundation*), we encounter the word *dross*. This word refers to unwanted material that is removed from mineral (such as gold) to make it better or purer. The hymn was originally published under the title *Exceedingly Great and Precious Promises*. Its author based each of its original seven stanzas on various Biblical promises including those found in Isaiah 41:10, Isaiah 43:2, 2 Corinthians 12:9, and Hebrews 13:5.
