Call to Worship

ABOUT THE MUSIC

Most music historians believe that the earliest Christians conducted their worship services without the use of instruments. Since most of the early Christians were Jewish converts, they were accustomed to synagogue worship in which there was no instrumental music. Besides, during those years of widespread persecution of Christians, the sound of instruments in worship would have only called more attention to their gatherings. Furthermore, instruments were associated with pagan customs. Later, as Christianity spread to the Gentiles, Greek philosophy influenced the use of music in the church. The "Doctrine of Ethos" was an important consideration. What was this doctrine? Is this doctrine relevant today? See upcoming articles in About the Music.
