A voice is crying out in the wilderness: Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near. Trusting in God's grace, let us confess our sin.

About the Music:

The hymn *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel* is based upon the "O Antiphons" which are more than a thousand years old. The antiphons were used during the period of the week before Christmas at Vespers. Each antiphon highlights a different title for the Messiah:

- O Sapientia (O Wisdom),
- O Adonai (O Lord),
- O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse),
- O Clavis David (O Key of David),
- O Oriens (O Rising Sun),
- O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations), and
- O Emmanuel (O God with us).

Some believe that monks arranged these antiphons in this order with a definite purpose. If one starts with the last title and takes the first letter of each one - Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia - the Latin words ero cras are formed, meaning, "Tomorrow, I will come." The Latin was translated into English in the 19th century by John Mason Neale, an Anglican priest and gifted scholar.

Advent is a season of four weeks before Christmas.

During the Advent season, the church claims God's promise to bring peace and justice to earth by remembering Jesus' birth in Bethlehem and by looking far to the future, trusting that we can count on God to keep a promise.


