Thanks for serving on a worship team this year!

Pleas review these guidelines. Most refer to providing intentional hospitality in the broad sense. We are doing more than handing out bulletins and providing refreshments. We are making our facility welcoming to all – members and visitors alike.

- 1. Please wear your nametag.
- 2. Be ready to greet by 10:15. While our members tend to file in at the last minute, visitors often come earlier. On the rare Sundays when Leslie is not setting up for fellowship, the team will need to do that before 10:15.
- 3. Large print bulletins are provided along with the regular bulletins each Sunday. Bulletins are on the table with the nametags. Collection plates are on the shelf in the little room behind the organ.
- 4. Be sure to keep all the sanctuary doors open. Late arrivals may not want to open these doors once the service has begun.
- 5. If you are a greeter, wait to sit down until the end of the first hymn just in case visitors come in late.
- 6. If a visitor asks for directions to the restroom, or childcare, it's best to take them or ask someone else to take them to their destination.
- 7. During the Offering, you may have wondered, "Do I stay or do I go?" After Annie takes the plates, return to your seat.
- 8. Elders helping with Communion should come forward during the Offering and sit in the front pew. Annie will let you know when it's time to come forward to get the juice and bread. When serving, say "This is the body of Christ broken for you" and "This is the cup of salvation."
- 9. Please count attendees (adults and children), but not Annie or Gay. Write the total in the log book in the drawer of the table in the foyer.
